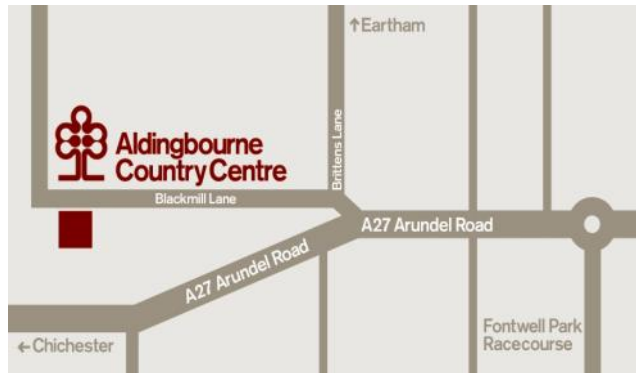


How To Find Us

Open Farm

Visit our farm and experience fun for all the family.

Observe from afar or get up close, and take time to meet our rare breed animals, which include pigs, goats, alpacas, rabbits, guinea pigs, chickens and a pony. They are all very friendly!

- Educational information boards mean families can learn together about the animals.
- Hold and stroke a guinea pig, chicken or rabbit.
- Hand washing facilities on site.
- Open seven days, 10am - 4pm.
- No charge to observe the animals whilst walking around the animal enclosures on the designated pathways.
- A small charge is made for those children and adults wishing to enter the enclosure and “get up close” to the animals. (All monies received will go towards the care and upkeep of the animals).



A Charitable Day Out

The open farm is just one of the many things you and your family can see and do at the Aldingbourne Country Centre.

Walk through our wood with its pond and play equipment, buy our organically grown plants and vegetables, browse in the gift shop selling local crafts and indulge in an appetising lunch or just a coffee in our refurbished cafe .

The Aldingbourne Trust is a charity dedicated to helping people with learning difficulties realise their full potential. At the Country Centre adults with learning difficulties work as key members of all the activities and social enterprises. You can even buy recycled wood collected by our timber recycling project, have your wooden furniture restored or have your horse rugs and duvets washed.

If you like the idea of having a fun family day out and supporting a local charity at the same time then the Aldingbourne Country Centre is well worth a visit.



Children's Play Area

We are fortunate to be located on the borders of the South Downs National Park, one of the most scenic areas in the country and our woodland area is home to a wide range of wildlife and has a tranquil, meandering path.

Situated within the heart of our wood are lots of exciting things for children to discover. Our play area gives children an opportunity to climb and generally let off steam. The nature trails will help them to learn about nature, observe pond life and explore whilst having fun. Pond dipping is available by arrangement.

There are many spots which are ideal for picnics and we also hire out our facilities for children's birthday parties.

Whilst the children are at play, you'll have an opportunity to view our Grass Roof Bothy, which was designed and built by Ben Law, a local builder who was featured on Channel 4's Grand Designs.
